Board Matters

Treasurer's Report

Mike McNeil's review of the Association's financial affairs started with the confirmation that the auditors had given the books a "clean opinion," which in his words was an "opinion that is wanted."

The preliminary financial statements were mailed to members and are substantially identical with the final version as approved by the auditors.

Currently, the perspective, he said, was "a bit brighter" but, since we are accumulating a small amount each month to put our working capital in an improved position, there should be improvement.

Mr. McNeil announced that the Board had approved a contribution to the Lounge Lobbyists campaign the sum of \$500.00.

GAB Robbins, a firm that has been hired to conduct the reserve study, has completed its work. The results are being studied by the Reserve and Operating committees.

Operating Committee

Ernie Giordano summarized recent activities of the Operating Committee. New umbrellas have been put in place at Pool #1 and lounges have been ordered so that a full complement at all pools should be on hand by October.

A solution to problems with the north well has not been determined as there are conflicting opinions as to the best remedy. It appears that it may be difficult to solve and could be costly.

A review of a pest control firm is currently under-

way as well. While the final decision has not been made, Ernie indicated that a change in the contractor is likely.

A contract to replace electrical outlets at the docks with ground fault indicator units has been let.

Deficiencies in the work by the contractor dealing with concrete and screen/railing work are being recorded. When the punch list is finalized the Operating committee will be dealing with the contractor regarding remedial work.

The number and size of facilities to handle bicycle storage also is under review. Dave Filkins is working with the Operating committee regarding this matter.

Grills

The Board took steps to "regularize" the installation of the existing barbeque grills by passing a motion approving the grills at "C" and "G" buildings with the same stipulations as approved with "A-B," and "I-J-K-L" grills, namely that nothing but the grill may be erected or placed in the area without the approval of the Operating Committee.

It then amplified this approval by authorizing the installation of one small green concrete bench at the grill sites, provided the bench be at the option and expense of the grill owners.

Bike Storage

In a move to clarify details regarding bike storage, the Board confirmed that steps will be taken to remove bicycles that do not have a current tag. Assuming the owner can be identified, a letter will be

delivered to an Owner who is in residence or mailed to the home address of record, if the Owner is not here. From the date of mailing, the Owner will have thirty days to obtain a current year identification tag. Failure to do so will result in the bike's removal to a location behind the Recreation Hall. Six months later the bike will be disposed of.

Owners, who are currently elsewhere and who wish to retain their bikes, may request the Administrative Office to apply a current bike tag on their behalf. **This courtesy will be available one time only.**

HELP FOR OWNERS AUTHORIZED

In order to assist Owners who do not (or cannot) properly close and prepare their unit for long term vacancy will now be able to have someone else close and open the unit. The Board has voted to make available such a service.



On request (and for a charge), maintenance personnel will undertake to shut-off the water and hot water heater and properly seal the toilets. The Owner is to provide written authorization along with the fee for the service. Further, the Owner must agree that if the main water valve is inoperable, not a ball valve (as shown at right), or if any other hazardous condition exists, the Owner authorizes the Association to have the deficiency repaired at the Owner's expense by a licensed trade.



The fee payable to the Association by the Owner is not to exceed twenty dollars (\$20.00) for each opening or closing. Forty eight (48) hours notice of closing or opening, exclusive of weekends, will be required. A form for this purpose will be available in the office.

BEACH CHAIRS

Owners were reminded at the Board meeting that beach chairs must be tagged with the current year's identification. During the summer the storage area will be purged of any chairs that do not have a current tag affixed.

ADMIN. OFFICE - KEY CONTROL



Owners are requested to provide neighbors with backup keys to their units. Over the years members of the Board of Directors have willingly (and at considerable inconvenience) assisted Owners who have inadvertently locked themselves out of a unit. Over time the number of inner-office keys in circulation has increased.

It has been found necessary to restrict access to the Manager's office in off-hours. There are now only eight keys in circulation. Three of those are assigned to staff members, the remainder are held by Board Officers.

Please do not call upon them *except in the most extreme emergency*. Anticipate **that one day you will lock yourself out**. Be thoughtful and arrange for one or more of the keys to your unit to be in the hands of friends and neighbors.

NEW BOARD MEMBER

Attendees at the March meeting of the Board were surprised by the resignation of **Trudee Trudell** from the Board. Her resignation required a realignment of the officers of the Association. **John Bock** was asked and agreed to act as Secretary.

FEDERATION

Barbara Hulyk asked owners to add their names to a petition being sent to Tallahassee legislators who are now considering bills that seriously interfere with the orderly operation of condominiums. One of the proposed bills is 90 pages in length and contains such provisions as the requirement that any entry by association personnel into a unit must be accompanied by a Board member. Many other such "impossible" measures are contained in the proposal.

RECREATION

Warren Conrad's "State of the Union" contained not only a review of events but comments on defining a "clubhouse," elsewhere on this page. He thanked **Barbara Shelton** for her efforts in organizing the Owners' Party which was attended by 166 persons. The Lounge Lobbyists also came in for well deserved praise. The Pizza Party had 145 sign up for the event..

The last New Year's Eve event had disappointing attendance and lost money. The Recreation Committee will not host an event on December 31st this year, though the Rec Hall may be available for an informal gathering.

During the summer the annual summer music concert will be held either June 12th or 13th under the chairmanship of **Ann Sweet**. Ann will also chair the usual Independence Day picnic.

The first event of the autumn will be Oktoberfest, chaired by **Pat Warner**. Check the schedule elsewhere in this issue for the full calendar.

IN MEMORIAM

Jack Levy, longtime Treasurer of the Men's Club, passed away last April 1st. Jack had returned to his home area of Scotia, NY, near Schenectady. His humor brightened the weekly financial reports.

Phyllis McCloskey died March 24th at the age of 90. Phyllis had only recently left Longboat Harbour after 35 years in the Sarasota area, almost all of them here at Longboat Harbour.

Landscaping Committee

Planting of shrubs continued at L Building, K Building, and to a lesser extent at B, G and I Buildings. One hundred new shrubs were added to fill vacant areas, and to replace unsuitable or overgrown plants, with emphasis on drought tolerant plants such as Arboricola, Carissa, and Croton.

Flowers were added to the beds at the end of walks along the canal and bay. Blue Daze and Gazania, which are fairly long lasting perennials, were used.

Two beds of Indian Hawthorn, near G Building, and between D and E Building were removed, and sod installed in those areas. In these beds, the Indian Hawthorn was very unhealthy, and many plants were dying. These beds had been planted by our former maintenance supervisor Leon, and plants had been replaced several times as some of them died off. Throughout the Condo grounds, some Indian Hawthorn plants have died, and spraying with insecticides and fungicides have been used to mitigate the problem with uncertain results. Until we have a definite solution to the problem, Indian Hawthorn will not be planted. It has been a standard and much-used plant because of its compact growth habit. In its place we are trying Ficus 'Green Island', a compact plant with glossy green foliage.

Two coconut palms were planted at the beach, along the La Playa border in a region where Oleander plants were dying. A Chinese palm which was intruding on a sidewalk at G Building was dug up and planted in this same area. Our long-term goal is to replace most of the Oleander with palms and other plants which will enhance the tropical aspect of the beach property. The Harbour Towers Condo removed all the old unattractive Ligustrum along their boundary, including several planted by them in a little island on our property. In this island we planted Ruella, Croton, and a European Fan palm.


