BOARD REPORT

Treasurer's Report

Treasurer Mike McNeil advised the Board that operating results year-to-date were adversely impacted by building repairs and uncollectible maintenance fees. The accumulated three month operating loss from operations was \$20,757. The March loss resulted in a 10% decrease in liquidity to just over \$300,000.

A total of \$31,558 of the \$40,000 building repair budget for 2010 has already been expended and there appears to be no immediate improvement in the building maintenance problems. A lanai has been identified as requiring new support posts that may cost approximately \$14,000 to repair.

The persistent failure of four units to be current in their obligations for the payment of maintenance fees that now exceed \$30,000 has prompted the Board to institute foreclosure of the Claim of Liens and collection costs for outstanding fees, special assessments, and late fees. Units E-206 and M-204 are the first of the owners to be affected by this more aggressive action. Another unit, F-207 has been brought current but the Board is prepared to start proceedings in this case as well if the account falls behind again. As for the fourth delinquent unit, Country Wide, the first mortgage holder, has instituted foreclosure proceedings.

These actions reflect the Boards resolve to address delinquencies aggressively.

Operating Committee

Throughout this spring, a season of lower than normal temperatures and persistent winds, our maintenance team continued its work in maintaining and improving the grounds and facilities.

Fencing, similar to what is around the barbeque, was in-



stalled at the walkway to the office in order to hide the A/C units and present a more pleasant curb appeal for the entrance to the office. In addition, a small pond was installed beside the walkway – thanks to all who have complimented the installation of the pond.

In his remarks, Ernie thanked the Recreation Committee for



its generous donation towards landscaping improvements at the north entrance to the clubhouse as well.

A new Bar-B-Q was installed in the area near the Recreation hall. **Ernie Giordano** mentioned at the Board meeting that in the 30 years he has been here the fountain located near the Yacht club's storage has never worked. Well, it is now is operational, repaired by our staff.

The Rec Hall air conditioner/heater replacement is complete. Cost of this work totaled \$1,600. Roof leaks in the Administration/Gym/Rec. Buildings were repaired at a cost of \$5,200.

In Building "C" a break in the main water line required the water in the entire community be turned off while repairs were done. A new shut-off ball valve replaced the gate valve so if further repairs are needed in building "C," the water to the entire community

will not have to be shut down. (Cost: \$1,700) The age of our buildings suggests that action be taken to minimize such disruptions in the future. Therefore, over the course of the summer, our maintenance people will replace, where needed, the old gate valves with ball valves. Also in "C" building - the landscaping improvements are now complete.

Repairs to the fascia around the gym and many other routine but important items were completed.

The Operating Committee is well aware of the strain on our budget because of uncollectible maintenance fees and the cost of building repair issues that have arisen during the first four months of 2010. The Committee advised that needed repairs be done and it will continue with our general enhancement program where the financial exposure is minimal and labor can be performed by the staff.

The draw for the next building to have its landscaping modified was held at the April Board meeting and the winner is: "K" Building. Ernie quickly reminded everyone that it may not be done right away but "K" is, indeed, next.

Renting

The Board announced that the Fining Committee had determined that there had been a violation of our rental rules and recommended accordingly that the owner of Unit H-103 be fined for failure to submit an application to rent prior to allowing the use of the unit

President Kasden also disclosed that one of this year's renters, a consistent violator of our rules, will not be permitted to rent at Longboat Harbour in the future.

One benefit to owners of the application requirement is protection from tenants who violate our rules.

The Board, on the advice of the Rental Committee, will recommend to Owners that the period in which no more than two rental be allowed be changed from "twelve months" to "calendar year" (January 1 to December 31).






